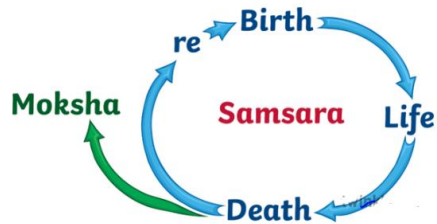


Key Vocabulary

Important Facts

The story of **Job** in the Jewish and Christian scriptures. *Job is presented as a good and prosperous family man who is beset by Satan with God's permission with horrendous disasters that take away all that he holds dear, including his offspring, his health, and his property. He struggles to understand his situation and begins a search for the answers to his difficulties. It is important to Jews that they make good choices in their lives and try to relieve suffering. In times of suffering, Jews may turn to the Book of Job where God allows Satan to test Job. Satan suggests that Job would not worship God if God did not protect him. Job is portrayed as a most righteous man, recognised as such by God.*

**Paul the Apostle.**

He was originally called Saul until he was baptised as a Christian and changed his name to Paul. He travelled around the Roman Empire, teaching others about Christianity, and wrote letters back and forth with the churches he helped to begin. The letters contain many important parts of Christian teaching. It is not certain how Paul was killed, but most believe that the Emperor Nero ordered his beheading and so he died a martyr for his faith.



Most religious traditions teach about some form of **life after death**, which can bring comfort to people as they face suffering, or if they are bereaved. Believing in heaven or paradise make it more possible to bear suffering on Earth for most faiths. This therefore helps them to have resilience against hard times in their lives.

**Christianity:** The Bible teaches the resurrection of the body, judgment by God, salvation through Jesus and belief in heaven.

**Hinduism:** Hindu's hold the belief that the law of karma affects the reincarnation of the individual atman (soul), pinning it to samsara (the cycle of life death and rebirth) until it can escape (moksha) and be absorbed back to Brahman. For most Hindus, moksha refers to merging with the Brahman, while others according to their denomination may prefer a different 'destination'.



**Humanists** believe that nothing happens after death, they believe people might continue in people's memories and through our achievements, but death is final.
