<p>God- A supreme being</p> <p>Divine- is like God or a god.</p> <p>Bible text- writing including stories and teachings from Jesus in the bible.</p> <p>Religious experience- practical contact with God or observation of facts or events.</p> <p>Holy- dedicated to God or a religious purpose. It is sacred.</p> <p>Psalm- a sacred song or hymn</p> <p>Cathedrals –is a grand church, which the bishop is officially associated.</p> <p>Humanist- supporting the principles of humanism.</p> <p>Justice- a concern for peace, and respect for people.</p> <p>Balance- a situation in which different elements are equal.</p>	<p>God is described in many ways, one being that God is a supreme being.</p> <p>There are many Biblical ideas that Christians believe about God. The Bible texts in Psalm 103 (in the prayer of King David) describes God as righteous, gracious, compassionate, loving and forgiving.</p> <p>Isaiah 6:1–5 (where a prophet had a religious experience) described Lord as almighty, high, holy and glorious.</p> <p>John 4:7–13 (where one of the followers of Jesus writes a letter about what God is like).</p> <p><i>“God is love. No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God abides in us and his love is perfected in us. By this we know that we abide in him and he in us, because he has given us of his Spirit.”</i></p> <p>Christian worship songs talk about God, they emphasise the idea of God’s holiness and love.</p> <div style="display: flex; justify-content: space-around; align-items: flex-start;"> <div data-bbox="936 775 1167 963" style="text-align: center;">  </div> <div data-bbox="1182 775 2049 1117" style="width: 80%;"> <p>Medieval Christians built cathedrals ‘to the glory of God’. The cathedral, along with some of the abbey churches, was the largest building in any region.</p> <p>The reasons for this:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The cathedral was created to the Glory of God. It was seen as appropriate that it should be as grand and as beautiful as wealth and skill could make it. • Cathedrals are also traditionally places of pilgrimage, to which people travel from afar to celebrate certain important feast days or to visit the shrine associated with a particular saint. </div> </div>		<div style="text-align: center;">  </div> <p>Some people do not believe in God, they are called Atheists.
