<p>Worship- is an act of religious devotion.</p> <p>Shahada- a declaration of faith and belief in God and Muhammad the messenger.</p> <p>Shema- a Jewish prayer</p> <p>Lord's Prayer- a Christian prayer.</p> <p>Salat (or salah)-is daily ritual of prayer carried out by muslims five times a day.</p> <p>Shabbat (or Sabbath)- is Judaism's day of rest and seventh day of the week.</p> <p>Guru Granth Sahib- is the Sikh scriptures in Sikhism. (compiled by the ten gurus in Sikhism)</p> <p>Eucharist- the Christian ceremony remembering the Last Supper, in which bread and wine are consecrated and consumed as the body and blood of Christ.</p>	<p>In different religions, worship is an activity expressed in many parts: community, music, prayer, ritual, symbol, shared food but also service to God and other people. Worship can be private or shared, daily, weekly or occasional.</p> <div data-bbox="880 363 1003 512" data-label="Image"> </div> <p>Where do people go to worship? People use places of worship to seek peace, to think deeply, to be part of a community or to seek the presence of God. A Mosque, Synagogue, Church, Mandir and Gurdwaras are all places of worship which provide followers to focus on praying and connecting with God/Gods.</p> <p>What is a prayer? Words of a prayer is an expression and devotion to God.</p> <p>-In <u>Islam</u>, Muslims recite the Shahada (declaration of faith): "There is no God but Allah, and Muhammad is the messenger of Allah."</p> <p>-In <u>Judaism</u>, the most important prayer is the Shema. The opening line is recited twice a day and reminds Jews of their belief: 'Hear, O Israel, the Lord our God, the Lord is One.'</p> <div data-bbox="1888 687 2042 799" data-label="Image"> </div> <p>-In <u>Christianity</u>, there is the Lord's prayer which is read 'Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our sins and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil as we forgive those who sin against us for the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours now and forever. Amen'</p> <p>What happens when people worship?</p> <p>-Christians use bread and wine to remember Jesus in the Eucharist/Lord's Prayer.</p> <p>-Muslims pray the Five Daily Prayers.</p> <p>-Hindus carry out puja which is the daily worship of gods and goddesses.</p> <p>-Jewish people worship on Shabbat at home with family and worship in the synagogue.</p> <div data-bbox="1865 1093 2051 1222" data-label="Image"> </div>
