Children need to understand:

- The purpose of a money container
- How their product can be adapted to meet the criteria of a particular target audience or specific purpose.

William Morris



He was a revolutionary force in Victorian Britain: his work as an artist, designer, craftsman, writer and socialist dramatically changed the fashions and ideologies of the era.

Design brief: To design and make a money container.

Functional considerations: The container needs to have a compartment, including a gusset for the money.



It needs to have a fastening that will be easily opened/closed and will keep the money inside.

Aesthetic considerations: The container needs to be visually appealing. The product needs to have at least two decorative features.


Children need to select tools, materials, equipment, components to help them make their money container:

- Needle
- Thread
- Various materials e.g. felt
- Various fastenings including buttons

Children need to be able to set up the equipment and use it effectively and safely. Children need to be able to thread a needle and use at least two different stitches.

Small stitches make a very tight seam.

Fray – when the fabric unravels or becomes worn at the edge.
 Wears – when the fabric becomes damaged by friction.
 Gusset - a piece of material sewn to strengthen or enlarge a part of it.
