


Silk Screen Printing	Key Vocabulary / information

Screen print: A variety of stencil printing, using a screen made from fabric (silk or synthetic) stretched tightly over a frame.

A squeegee or squilgee is a tool with a flat, smooth rubber blade, used to remove or control the flow of liquid on a flat surface. It is used for cleaning and in printing. The name "squeegee" may come from the word "squeege", meaning press or squeeze, which was first recorded in 1783.

Lithography is a printing process that uses a flat stone or metal plate on which the image areas are worked using a greasy substance so that the ink will adhere to them by, while the non-image areas are made ink-repellent.

Graffiti art as a term refers to images or text painted usually onto buildings, typically using spray paint.

Graffiti tag: A tag is the most basic writing of an **artist's** name; it is simply a hand style. A **graffiti writer's tag** is his or her personalized signature.

Propaganda: (Noun) information, especially of a biased or misleading nature, used to promote a political cause or point of view.
