<p><u>'We are researchers'</u></p> <p>In this unit, you will safely research a topic, and use mind maps to help organise your ideas. You will share your findings with others through a short multimedia presentation (maybe using a video or a PowerPoint presentation).</p> <p>This unit will enable you to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• develop cooperation skills through working as part of a group</li> <li>• develop research skills through searching for information on the internet</li> <li>• improve note-taking skills</li> <li>• develop presentation skills through creating and delivering a short multimedia presentation.</li> </ul> <p>By the end of term, you will know how to retrieve ideas from the internet with a particular purpose in mind. You will use mind-mapping software to organise ideas, and presentation software to edit and improve the content.
