





<p>Improvise– making it up as you go along</p> <p>Unison– when a group sing the same notes and words together</p> <p>Texture – layers of sound in a piece of music</p> <p>Ostinato– a repeated pattern <i>It can be a rhythmic pattern or contain a melody.</i></p> <p>Rhythm – follows the pattern of words.
