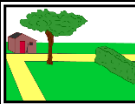

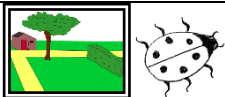
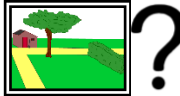

Read a sentence to your partner. Can they match it to the correct picture/s on the right-hand side?		Grammar - A cognate is a word in one language that is related in origin to a word in another language, for example: un parc (a park), un cinéma (a cinema), orange (orange). They have similar spelling, they sound almost the same and they have the same meaning. - In French, nouns are divided into 2 categories: masculine and feminine. In French, all nouns have a gender, in English they do not. In French, the determiner must match the gender of the noun that it introduces. The indefinite article is un with masculine nouns, and une with feminine. - When an adjective describes a noun, the adjective must agree with the gender of the noun. When an adjective describes <i>a feminine noun</i>, it must agree by adding an 'e', unless it already ends in an 'e'. - The French pronoun 'je' is the equivalent of the English pronoun 'I'. - When a sentence begins with a fronted adverbial, it needs to be followed by a comma, just like in English, e.g. <u>Dans le jardin</u>, il y a une abeille. <u>In the garden</u>, there is a ladybird. Pronunciation - In English, the grapheme 'oi' is pronounced as in oil, boil and soil. In French, it is pronounced [w], as in poisson, bois, trois and étoile. - If a word ends with an -e without an accent, then that e will be silent, e.g. une abeille, une coccinelle, une étoile.
