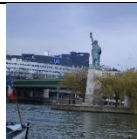

Read a sentence to your partner. Can they match it to the correct picture on the right-hand side?		Grammar - The abbreviation no. is used as a number label in both English and French (e.g. no. 1). It comes from the Latin word <i>numero</i>. - The ligature œ as in 'Sacré-Cœur' is known as "ø e stuck together". It occurs in French words such as <i>cœur</i> (heart) or <i>sœur</i> (sister). Ligatures used to be included in English words such as <i>phoenix</i> or <i>foetus</i>, but their use has fallen out of favour and they are rarely seen in current written English. - In French, just like in English, the names of monuments and landmarks are written with capital letters, e.g. the <u>E</u>iffel <u>T</u>ower = la <u>T</u>our <u>E</u>iffel. - In French, we use a <i>comp</i> after the fronted adverbial, e.g. <u>In Paris</u>, there is the river Seine. <u>À Paris</u>, il y a la Seine. Pronunciation - The grapheme i is pronounced as long 'ee' (see, meet, etc.). Il y a... (There is/are), aussi (as well/too), à Paris (in Paris).
