<p>Grammar</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> In French, the adjective that describes a noun follows it (with some exceptions, e.g. petit (small) and grand (large) – they precede the noun they describe). An adjective that describes a masculine noun does not change its sound. An adjective that describes a feminine noun must “agree” with its noun; t must end with ‘e’. An adjective that already ends in ‘e’ does not need to add another ‘e’, e.g. rouge, jaune, orange, rose. An adjective that does not end in ‘e’ must add one, e.g. petite, grande. This means that the pronunciation changes. In French, the first ordinal number is <i>le premier</i> or <i>la première</i>. We use <i>le premier</i> with a masculine noun, and <i>la première</i> with a feminine noun Elision is the omission of a sound or syllable when speaking. When elision occurs in speaking, the written form uses an apostrophe to replace the missing letter(s). For example, il n’y a pas d’école. Ordinal numbers are usually formed by adding the suffix <i>-ième</i> to the cardinal number, for example deux <i>ième</i> (second), trois <i>ième</i> (third), etc.

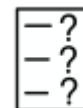
