
























landmark	A feature of the landscape, either natural or man-made, that is easily recognized and serves as a point of reference.		Italy Colosseum of Rome – built by the Romans in AD80 to hold large events such as fighting for the entertainment of the public.		
tourism	When people travel to a place for leisure, recreation or to experience something new.		China Great Wall of China - a wall built over 100s of years to protect China's borders from invaders.		
population	The total number of people living in an area.		Egypt Great Pyramids of Giza – built as a tomb for deceased Egyptian Pharaohs and other important Egyptian people in Cairo.		
World Heritage Site	Special natural or physical places which need to be protected because they are so important.		Australia Great Barrier Reef – a natural occurring biome which is home to a wide variety of plant and animal life on Australia's north coast.		
temperate climate	A climate which has rain all year round and has clearly defined seasons.		Peru Machu Picchu – a place which was (probably) used for members of Inca royalty to stay at in modern day Peru.		
London	The capital city of England and the United Kingdom.		USA Golden Gate Bridge – a bridge built in 1933 to join San Francisco with Marin County, California, USA.		
United Kingdom	The countries of England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland and most of the smaller islands around the coast.				
biome	An area with a similar climate and landscape, where similar animals and plants have adapted to live.
