In this unit, you will be learning how to take a good photograph and give them simple edits using **Pixlr** website or app.



You shall be using an **iPad** to take photographs and you need to know to use the **camera app** to do this

You need to know how to hold the iPad so you can take a **portrait** orientated photo or a **landscape** orientated photo.



Light and Tints

There are different **light sources**: more **natural** light, activating the camera flash or use an **artificial** (opposite of natural) light source e.g. lamp.

Tint means shade or variety of colour and **sepia** means a reddish-brown colour

- A **blue** tint makes the image appear colder
- A **red** tint makes the image appear warmer
- **black and white/sepia** effect makes the image appear more old-fashioned

E-safety

We teach our children to be SMART online

S Stay Safe: Don't give out your personal information to people / places you don't know. Illustration: A boy and a girl talking.

M Don't Meet Up: Meeting someone you have only been in touch with online can be dangerous. Always check with an adult you trust. Illustration: Two children talking.

A Accepting Files: Accepting emails, files, pictures or texts from people you don't know can cause problems. Illustration: A computer monitor with a virus icon.

R Reliable?: Check information before you believe it. Is the person or website telling the truth? Illustration: A smiling computer monitor.

T Tell Someone: Tell an adult if someone or something makes you feel worried or uncomfortable. Illustration: A hand pointing to a speech bubble that says 'Follow these SMART tips to keep yourself safe online!'.

Handy tips for taking good photos

1. Hold the device firmly with both hands.
2. Point the camera lens at the subject.
3. Look into the viewing window or screen.
4. Move the device until you can see everything clearly.
5. Press the capture button.
