| <p>Belong- to be part of something like a group or celebration.</p> <p>Jummah- is a collective worship on a Friday afternoon carried out by Muslims.</p> <p>Azan- is a call for prayers in Islam.</p> <p>Church- a sacred place where Christian attend to worship, pray and get closer to God. Chapel, cathedral.</p> <p>Mosque- is a sacred place where Muslims attend to worship.</p> <p>God- A supreme being</p> <p>Bible- Christians holy book.</p> <p>Qu'ran –Muslim holy book.</p> <p>Baptism- The Christian rite of initiation, involving immersion in water or sprinkling with water.</p> | <p>Belonging can be linked to many aspects. For a child belonging can mean being part of a class, school, clubs and their families. The identify a badge, town or village sign, Beavers, Rainbows or uniform that you wear shows that you belong.</p> <p>The family is the first form of belonging that people are born into. A family tree helps show the order of family members. Having a role in the family is a sign of belonging e.g. mum, dad, brother, sister, aunty etc</p> <p>People choose to belong to each other when they get married. They exchange rings as a symbol of belonging to each other. They exchange vows (promise) to care for each other.</p> <p>Christians show belonging when babies are baptised. Being baptised at birth is an initiation that they are part of a religious group. Muslims say the azan in the newborn baby's ear straight after it is born.</p> <p>People who believe in God belong to a family too – a religious family. People belong to a religious group by sharing beliefs in God, the messenger, prophet and the religious teachings. Families or groups that share the same worship is a sign of belonging. Muslims gather together in a mosque for Friday prayers called Jummah.</p> <p>People wear certain religious items to show that they belong to a religious group eg:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Hinduism mandir om/aum symbol – Judaism synagogue skull cap – Christianity church cross/fish – Islam mosque prayercap – Sikhism gurdwara turban – Buddhism temple prayer beads. | | |
