<p>Key Vocabulary</p> <p>Rhythm - follows the pattern of words, it is often different to the pulse</p> <p>Tuned instrument- A tuned instrument can play a specific note for example a recorder, piano, violin and clarinet.</p> <p>Pulse - the steady beat</p> <p>Solo - to sing or play on your own</p> <p>Unison - to sing or play the same part altogether</p>		<p>Through playing tuned instruments:</p> <p>I can play the note B on the recorder.</p> <p>I can play four beat rhythms on the recorder.</p> <p>I can read four beat rhythms.</p> <p>I can play chime bars to a rhythm.</p>

<p>Composer for the half term</p> 		<p>Gustav Holst 1874-1934</p> <p>He was a famous English composer. He studied composition at the Royal College of Music in London. He also learned to play the trombone. He became Director of Music at St Paul's Girls' School, Hammersmith, (London). His most famous work is The Planets (1918). This is a suite of seven movements for orchestra, each about a different planet.</p>
