

<p>Find a picture of you as a baby. How have you changed? Draw or stick a picture of you as a baby into your book and write down how you have changed.</p>	<p>Freeze some water to make ice cubes. Find out how long it takes to melt an ice cube. Write down how the ice feels. Is it sticky, smooth or rough? Is the ice hot or cold? How long does it take to melt the ice?</p>	<p>Have a go at adding one more and taking one away. Use objects to help you work it out and record your number sentence and answer.</p>
<p>Go for a walk with your parents and see how many different shapes you can find on your walk. Look at the road signs - can you see a triangle? How many sides does it have? Draw the shapes you find in your book.</p>	<p>Investigate things that float and sink in water for example a coin, rubber duck, an orange or a lemon. Write down what you find out.</p>	<p>Go for a walk and see if you can find any signs of spring. Draw a picture of what you saw.</p>
<p>Find out your family's favourite food or fruit or vegetable. Write your findings in your book.</p>	<p>During spring lots of animals have their babies. Find out the names of these baby animals, duck, pig, horse, cow and sheep.</p>	<p>Draw a picture of a flower. Remember to draw the petals, a stem and some leaves. Use your sounds to write labels for each part of your flower.</p>
