



The subject matter of a still life painting or sculpture is anything that does not move. • Pastels: small sticks of different coloured pigments (colours) that are used for drawing pictures, either made from chalk or oils. • Blending: mixing two or more colours to soften lines. • Blocking: painting in simple blocks, or shapes, of colour. • Hatching: an artistic technique used to create tonal or shading effects by drawing closely spaced parallel lines. • Scumbling: creating controlled scribbled marks. • Stippling: small, distinct dots of colour are applied in patterns to form an image. • Folkloric (adj): having the traditional beliefs, customs, and stories of a community, passed through the generations by word of mouth. • Surrealists: a group of artists who create fantastic and strange works of art, inspired by dreams.
