




<p>Pitch– how high or low a note is Duration– how long a note is Texture – layers of sound in a piece of music Notation– music in a written form</p> <p><i>It can be in simple form</i>  <i>or as musical notes</i> </p> <p>Round – a type of cannon, in which the same song is sang in groups starting at different times Interval – the difference/ relationship between two notes Pulse – the steady beat Rhythm - follows the pattern of words.
