<p><u>'We are web developers'</u></p> <p>This half term we will be learning to create a website about e-safety. You will develop your research skills to decide what information is appropriate. You will then be shown how to understand some elements of how search engines select and rank results, which will then enable you to question the plausibility (how believable something is), and quality of information. Throughout this half term you will develop your understanding of e-safety and how to be responsible when using technology.</p> <p>In this unit you will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Discuss ideas for creating your website. • Learn how the 'Search' option works. • Build your own web pages. • Add artwork, audio and video to your pages. • Review, and help improve, each other's pages. • Collect final feedback and publish your site. <p>You will learn many new facts and slogans about e-safety. One slogan devised by the UK Council for Child Internet Safety that will be taught will be:</p> <p><u>Zip it</u> – Don't share your personal information with strangers. Keep your profile settings private.</p> <p><u>Block it</u> – Block friend requests from strangers on social networking sites.</p> <p><u>Flag it</u> – Always tell a trusted adult if something online scares/upsets you. Report any meeting requests from strangers to a trusted adult. Remember to be as careful online as you are offline.
