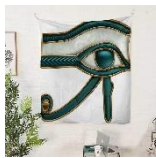

<p>Science – Look around your home, what materials have been used to make the objects? Why have these materials been chosen? What properties do the materials have that make them a good choice for particular objects? Why are some materials not a good idea for certain objects? (E.g. a tea pot made of chocolate)</p>	<p>RE – Look around your neighbourhood – what makes it a great place to live? What do you think could be improved? How do people in your community show respect for your neighbourhood? Design your own perfect neighbourhood. What facilities would you have? Who would live there? What would you do to ensure that it was respected?</p>	<p>History – Tutankhamun is one of the most famous Ancient Egyptian pharaohs. Make a fact file about him. Your fact file must include details of who he was, about his leadership, what makes him one of the most famous pharaohs.</p>
<p>History – The Ancient Egyptians ‘wrote’ using a picture alphabet called hieroglyphics. Design your own hieroglyphic alphabet. What would your name look like written in your alphabet. Try out other members of your family too.</p>	<p>Music – Our composer of the term is Hans Zimmer. Make a fact file all about him. Who is he? Where is he from? What sort of music does he compose? Listen to some of his music. What instruments can you hear playing? What do you like about it? What don’t you like about it? Explain why.</p>	<p>Computing – Make a poster promoting e-safety. What are the do’s and don’ts of keeping safe online? Why do social media sites and computer games have age limits? What could you do if you don’t feel safe online?</p>
<p>Art – Design a pattern in an Ancient Egyptian style that could be used to print on fabric.</p>	<p>Science – Make a list of reversible and irreversible changes to materials. What do the terms reversible and irreversible mean?</p>	<p>History – Write a diary entry as if you were a slave in Ancient Egyptian times.</p>
