Mobile Phone use on School Premises

Many schools have a policy that do not allow parents to use their mobile phones while on school premises. However, we are aware that the parents may occasionally have to take emergency calls. We would like to ask that parents and carers do not use phones where possible and avoid taking photographs and receiving or making video calls while on the school site. This will continue to ensure that we safeguard all our pupils and can dismiss children safely at the end of the day.

Pupil Absence

We have seen a large increase in pupils taking time out of school to visit family in other parts of the country or in overseas destinations. We understand that travel restrictions in the last 20 months have made it difficult to connect with families, especially where family members may be unwell. Unfortunately, we are unable to authorise visits like this and extended absences are likely to lead to the local authority issuing fines to parents. These are issued at a cost of £60 per parent, per child. Pupils may also be at risk of losing their place at our school. If you need to remove your children from school for any length of time; please fill in a leave of absence request — these can be given to you at the school office.

Extreme Weather Conditions

Please be reminded that should there be an occasion that we have to close the school due to extreme weather conditions that would make it unsafe for our pupils and staff to attend, notification will be sent by text message to parents; as well as updates on our school website. Although the school will only be closed in extreme circumstances pupils would be expected to attend as normal if we open.
