## Important Information for EU, EEA or Swiss Citizens

Did you know that although the deadline has passed, you can still apply to the EU Settlement Scheme for Settled or Pre-Settled status? If you haven't, it is important that you do so if you want to keep your rights to live, work or study in the UK and access healthcare and benefits. An application must also be made for every eligible child within a family even if the parent(s) have already applied and been granted a status themselves.

Advice can be given about applying as well as help to complete applications, or to give follow up support about refusals, evidencing the correct documents, contacting the Resolution Centre and switching from Pre-settled to Settled status.

Children should come to school on their PE day in their PE kit, which should be a white T-shirt, royal blue shorts, and trainers. Optional kit is a plain blue sweatshirt or blue River Bank fleece, black tracksuit bottoms or leggings. Ideally, children should not wear earrings to school, these can be taken out before they come to school and put back in when they return home. However, if your child does wear small stud earrings to school, on their PE days they should be taken out, or tape should be brought in from home so they can cover them over themselves.

### Late arrivals

It is the responsibility of parents and carers to ensure that their child/children attend school regularly and punctually. If you are experiencing any difficulties with your child arriving at school on time, our family team would welcome the opportunity of meeting with you to discuss this. Children who arrive after the register has closed are recorded as an unauthorised absence and regular lateness may result in a penalty notice being issued.

## **Collecting on Time**

It is vital that parents and carers pick their children up on time. Children who are not picked up on time become worried. It is not fair on them, or the teachers that have to wait with them. We allow a ten minute grace period for collecting because we understand that sometimes you are delayed and it cannot be helped. However, after that ten minute period or if a child is regularly late being collected; children will be placed into our after school club and you will be charged for this child care. This also applies to any after school clubs and extended days. This includes Fridays when EYFS, Y1 and Y2 finish at 12:45 and Y3 – Y6 finish at 13:00.
