Dear River Bank parents and carers

- Adults with the symptoms of a respiratory infection, and who have a high temperature or feel unwell, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until they feel well enough to resume normal activities and they no longer have a high temperature.
- Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact
 with other people. They can go back to school, college or childcare when they no longer have a high
 temperature, and they are well enough to attend.
- Adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be 3 days.

I hope that all of our families have a wonderful break and get to enjoy time together as a family. Many of our families will be celebrating Ramadan during this period. We wish all of our families a happy Ramadan and look forward to hearing about and sharing Eid celebrations later on in the month.
